Advocates to make menstrual products for free, which just passed.

- 1 in 4 students experience period poverty
- 1 in 4 college students experience period poverty.
- Every month they get together and create bags for a month's supply.
- All La Familia locations!
- UNM
- Adelante
- Several head start programs
- They also deliver Strive to serve all populations.
- SNAP or others do not supply these products. Santa Fe Youth project says this is not in their budget.

- Started in 2020 with a 501 C. Started in a garage with 300 bags.
- The bill just passed does not expire until 2024. Still questions about the quality of the products. There will be a quantity issue. Will there be enough products.
- Periods are happening earlier and heavier.
- Applying for grants and foundations have stepped forward.
- Started period poverty education in schools. And providing a name of it. Some of their schools in Santa Fe are 100% period poverty. And then they get to put together 100 bags.
- The Navajo nation has an amazing ceremony for a first period.
- Are boys involved? They would like boys to be involved.
- How bout Food Depot? They receive donations for period products.
- Period Pods like the book distribution. 300 bags a month.
- Some reach out for specific products.
- Where do they buy supplies? Amazon
- They would like own space to buy directly from Always, etc.
- People are particular about the products they like and this program is a bridge to what they like.
- Donations welcomed. A govt organization recently donated a lot of programs. They prefer \$\$\$. Or someone in charge of period pods.
