SEN. Linda Trujillo

—Pre-legislative Town Hall meeting. 5:30 at Farmer's market

—Won't do a rocket docket. But will be front loading. Sen Wirth, we are not going to incarcerate ourselves out of mental health and drug situation.

—Drug issues are not being met \$50M investment in collaborative and health groups. Groups supposed to help started in 2003 not functioning. They have not been funded. \$50M. Taking 1B and investing in a fund. We have taken extra funding coming in due to Oil and Gas and instead of doing one time funding and it's been invested in funds that have grown to the point that our budgets are not going to raise. We don't have 1B but we don't have the infrastructure to do this. The capital outlay sits around because we don't have people to execute. It's a long term investment - social workers, etc.

—Does Santa Fe need a mental health facility or is it just Las Vegas.

—Criminal law - places to invest in courts, pre detention oversight, pre-trial stuff.

—Her priorities

-Safe and well placed transmission lines. Take 2 - 5 years. We have to have 600 transmission lines by 2030.

—Help with strategic water supply

1. Brackish water - we have enough Yes, it can be cleaned What do we do with the leftover salt and minerals.

2. Produced water - used by O&G. Research being done. Maybe those two waters need to be separated in legislation. Can be used in things other than ag, Meta is building more servers. Those servers need water to be cool.

-Building codes updates. She started with Richardson. New Gov M she got rid of building codes. 2021 and 22 is the last thing. She doesn't want to leave it up to admims. She wants rules that rules have to be implemented in two years.

—Compacts - one in NM - nursing. Allows people in this compact can work in any state. We need to move in that direction . PT PSY, Teaching, Social, OT. Trail Lawyers have issues with those. State gives up authority.

Challenges: Nursing board doesn't know who is in NM (registering here in NM) . Good for Telehealth.

-Immigrant Health help - pathway for them to get licensed for two years, meet standards, prove they've been practicing for two years, etc.

—Legislative aides - she doesn't have one until April.

Compacts: will these attract more medical professionals? Probably not. But loan forgiveness, home for people. It allows people for Telehealth. Lots of people go to Mayo Clinic. Also better is for counseling.

Military bases get a grade. On a number of factors - inclusiveness to families. If you are assigned to one of our bases. And your husband is a doctor it could take a couple of years for him to practice. Allows military people to travel and have access to their licenses.

Transmission lines: CEC and AES PNM doesn't have capacity for transmission lines. Are you looking at underground? LT doesn't know.

Mission on Military Bases : they have things to do and those are determined Student loans forgiveness - health care professionals have \$200K debt coming out of school. Expand by service by 5 years in communities who have deficit, loans are forgiven.

PA compacts? Have a conversation about PAs

We are only 1 or 2% people have EVs here in NM. Most of us charge at home. We have to do more. DOT here has done a good job getting stations at pizza huts. etc.

Data about Compacts - we know where nurses are trained.

Strategic Water Supply - lots of conferences NMSU. Scientists from around the world. About the work that's been done. They use produced water in many states.

We don't have access to brackish or produced water. But if we can get other communities to stop used water that would be great.

Wildlife - she supports this.

Paid Family and non profit amendment

Barriers - not being able to solve the non profits not having enough \$ to afford the . Changing the CA for donations would solve this.

Andreas - eliminate the anti donation clause. LT not a fan of this. Housing and Eco development. Is good. The anti donation should be limited to health too.

Anti donation : outs are housing and eco and would like health. We passed the CA to allow donations to housing as well as Econ development.
